Entry Level

Mon 4/7/11 - Fri 29/7/11

The Entry level is a course for pure beginners, the emphasis is very much on conversational Welsh. We have dedicated and qualified tutors to make learning a fun experience - you won't regret joining!

Foundation Level

Mon 1/8/11 - Fri 26/8/11

The Foundation level course will expand on your Welsh speaking skills and is suitable for people who have completed the Entry level or people who may already have some knowledge of Welsh (i.e Welsh second language GCSE).

Entry & Foundation Level

Mon 4/7/11 - Fri 26/8/11

Both the Entry and Foundation level courses can be completed in 8 weeks to really get you ahead!

Intermediate Course - equivalent to school GCSE level

Mon 4/7/11 - Fri 29/7/11

The Intermediate course is for learners who have successfully completed the Entry level and Foundation Level courses or those who are already quite comfortable with the basic patterns of the language. The course will develop students' oral, written and aural skills.

It is possible for learners to attend either one or both of the above courses, Intermediate and Advanced 1 during the eight-week period.

Intermediate & Uwch 1

Mon 4/7/11 - Fri 26/8/11

It is possible to complete both Intermediate and Uwch 1 in only 8 weeks!

Cwrs Uwch 2 (Meistroli) - cyfateb â Safon Uwch / Lefel A yr ysgolion

Llun 4/7/11 - Gwe 29/7/11

Mae'r cwrs yn addas ar gyfer dysgwyr sydd wedi cwblhau'r cwrs Uwch 1.

Cyflwynir gwaith gwylio a deall ac iaith lenyddol. Datblygir sgiliau llafar ymhellach wrth drafod materion cyfoes.

Learners who attend 80% or more of the lessons will receive a certificate at an awards ceremony.



Outside the Classroom

The primary purpose of these courses is to ensure that learners communicate with each other and with fluent speakers in Welsh. A number of excursions will be held as an integral part of the learning process with the aim of extending



students' linguistic skills and appreciation of Welsh life and culture. Taking students out of the classroom and using Welsh in other contexts is of great benefit to the learning process as well as being informative and fun.

We also aim to ensure that people enjoy the course and use their Welsh language skills in a relaxed, informal environment and to that end we arrange informal social meetings after class and lunchtimes once a week. This is a great opportunity to get to know other learners and tutors, practise your Welsh and of course have a good time! the more you use the language the quicker you will learn.



Accommodation

The course can be attended on a residential (self catering) or non-residential basis. Residential students will be accommodated in the University's residence at South Talybont, which provides single en-suite accommodation. This accommodation is conveniently located only 15 minutes walk from our classroom location.

Please Note:

Accommodation in South Talybont is limited and places are allocated on a first come first served basis. South Talybont is comprised of single occupancy en-suite rooms in a shared flat of 4, 6 or 8 bedrooms with a communal kitchen area. Talybont Campus accommodation is University accommodation, it's clean, tidy but very simple.

Course fees

The Course fees are as follows

	4 week course	8 week course
Non-residential	£499	£999
Residential	£1250	£2500

A 50% reduction in the fee is available for the 4 or 8 week non-residential courses for any learners receiving an income-based benefit or if they are a student. To receive this reduction, a current copy of any relevant documentation noting their entitlement to a benefit, or their status as a student must be sent to the Centre with the enrolment form.
