all regular sessions take place in glamorgan building, king edward vii ave, cardiff, cf10 3wt

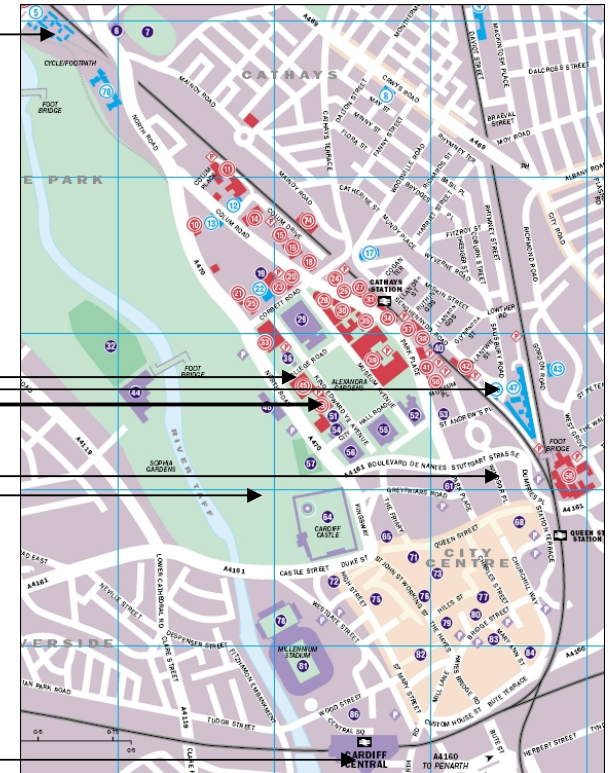
