




# Science Corner

In December, members of the DGFC team, alongside colleagues from Japan, the NGO HUTAN, Sabah Wildlife Department and others had a new paper published in *Oryx*. The paper outlines the importance of protecting riparian forest corridors for the long-term survival of the endemic proboscis monkey in Sabah. The study conducted from 2004-2014 revealed significantly reduced group sizes, probably resulting from habitat fragmentation. However, the population size does seem to be stable, despite the impending risk to habitat. The paper suggests that restoration of riparian areas could be crucial to ensure the viability of the proboscis monkey population in the Kinabatangan.



# Conservation Corner

## Sunda Clouded Leopard



They are a medium sized felid species but the largest found in Borneo, weighing from 10-25kg. Their name comes from the irregular shape of their coat markings.

They have the longest teeth proportionate to skull length than any living cat and have extremely long tails that aid their semi-arboreal movement. Found in Borneo and Sumatra, the Sunda clouded leopard is listed as vulnerable on the IUCN red list and there is



estimated to be 8000-18000 in the wild but more population data is required to give a more accurate figure. The Sunda clouded leopard is threatened by habitat loss due to oil palm plantations and poaching for fur and traditional medicine trade.

The clouded leopard is fully protected in Sabah and plenty of conservation projects exist to preserve this beautiful species. Here at DGFC we have a GPS tracking project for clouded leopards. Butir pictured above was fitted with a tracking collar while anaesthetised earlier this year.
