1. Programme Structure (curriculum design, programme structure and level, methods of teaching and learning)

The curriculum design is good, with an interdisciplinary approach to the subject area and the majority of application-specific modules in the third and fourth years. MEng students were particularly impressed with their fourth year syllabus and the amount of practical work they were doing.

There is currently a transition to 20 credit modules, which is a common move across the sector. Students raised concerns about this change removing semester 1 assessments, which they saw as an essential "wake-up call". The proposed 10% tests at the end of the autumn term may meet this requirement. I will be interested to see the results of implementing the routine recording of

teaching sessions and attendance monitoring.

2. Academic Standards (comparability with other UK HEIs, achievement of students, any PSRB requirements)

Academic standards are high and decisions are made in the interests of students, even when those may be administratively difficult e.g. changes to programmes when repeating. The course is accredited by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers and

their requirements were considered at the Board of Examiners. The proportion of good honours degrees awarded was in line with the achievements of the students.

**3.** The Assessment Process (enabling achievement of aims and learning outcomes; stretch of assessment; comparability of standards between modules of the same level)

The processes at the Board of Examiners were scrupulously fair and conducted to a high standard. One area that was not transparent to me was the policy of considering adjusting marks where the average for a module lies outside the range 45-65%. It is not clear to me what the mechanism is for this adjustment. This may be because I am used to a system with a separate assessment committee to moderate and agree marks prior to the Board of Examiners.

When reviewing the exam scripts, most packs of scripts did not contain question papers, which limited the value of the exercise.

I was pleased to see how positive the out-going external examiner was about the course and the department. In his last report there was a recommendation of secession planning for the programme director handover. I am glad to see this has been done and look forward to working with the new programme lead in future.

Students were particularly impressed with the Biomechanics and Biomedical Engineering group project in the MEng fourth year. This gave them an opportunity to tackle a real world issue in a substantive way and to adopt the sort of working practices they may need in graduate employment.
