## **GDPR** information for the AML15 trial

The Sponsor of this trial, and Data Controller, is Cardiff University. In order to analyse the different treatment options available in this trial, we gather data about your disease from participating centres. This would allow the trial team to effectively compare the different treatment options that were available. When the trial team analyse the data this is published in a peer-reviewed journal – these publications are made available on publically-accessible websites and are shared with the lead investigators at the participating centres.

The Sponsor and the investigators feel this data processing is necessary for the performance of this trial carried out in the public interest.

More than 100 centres around the world took part in this research. Individuals who consented to take part in this trial (and allow the Sponsor to store named data about them) could, potentially, be individually identified by the trial team from the data collected during the trial. However, no patient-identifiable data is included in any of the publications and patients cannot be identified in any way through data that is published.

Data from the AML15 trial contributes to the design of current and future trials in this disease area. The investigators would like to understand the survival of patients that received the treatment options so, for the moment, we do not know how long we will need to keep this data.

The investigators also need to ensure that no late effects are associated with the treatments in this trial. To achieve this, very limited data is requested from NHS Digital occasionally, in order to follow the status of patients who are no longer attending hospital visits.

If you are a patient on the AML15 trial you have the right to request from the controller access to and rectification or erasure of the personal data, or restriction of processing of personal data concerning the data subject, or to object to the processing of such personal data, as well as the right to data portability.
