

Commemorating World War I: Conflict and Creativity

2016 marks the centenary of the Battle of the Somme. Cardiff University's Centre for Interdisciplinary Research in Opera and Drama (CIRO) commemorates this event by exploring WWI conflict and creativity. How is the Great War represented in history, music, literature and visual cultures? And how is it remembered today, in Wales and the wider world?

Public events in collaboration with Welsh National Opera and National Museum Cardiff bring together leading researchers from the Cardiff University schools of Music, Modern Languages, Welsh, History, Archaeology and Religion, and Journalism, Media and Cultural Studies, as well as from international partner institutions.
