1. Programme Structure (curriculum design, programme structure and level, methods of teaching and learning)

The programme is structured excellently to support practitioners who are working full-time, and enable them to engage in post-qualifying study. The strong emphasis on reflective practice is a particular strength of this programme in an era of increased proceduralism and bureaucracy in social work practice.

2. Academic Standards (comparability with other UK HEIs, achievement of students, any PSRB requirements)

The majority of papers and projects reviewed were well structured, providing an introduction, a central thesis and a conclusion. The quality of the written work across all assessment formats was of an order expected at this stage of a post-qualifying programme. Both the standard of work and the distribution of marks was on a par with other similar postgraduate programmes that I am familiar with, in my own University and elsewhere.

3. The Assessment Process (enabling achievement of aims and learning outcomes; stretch of assessment; comparability of standards between modules of the same level)

Students were engaged in a combination of assessment types (both written assessment and observation of practice) which allowed them to play to their individual strengths. These assessments were clearly mapped to the learning outcomes and overall the assessment is both rigorous and fair and appropriate to the level of postgraduate work. Marking was internally consistent both across markers and within and across marking bands.
