# Preface from the Vice-Chancellor

Looking forward instead of back is not traditionally the remit of an Annual Review, but having taken up my post as Vice-Chancellor in the summer of 2012 – half way through the year in question - I feel it will be helpful whilst reflecting on achievements also to break with convention and outline plans for the University in the years ahead.

I feel very privileged to lead Cardiff University and build on the outstanding success of my predecessor, Dr David Grant, and all his colleagues. The University's achievements during his tenure have put the foundations in place to ensure that Cardiff remains a top research-intensive University.

Since joining Cardiff, my ambition has been clear: for this University consistently to rank among the top 100 in the world and the top 20 in Britain. To help us achieve this aim, I am focusing the University's energy on four key areas: research, education, internationalisation and engagement with Cardiff and Wales.

Tackling issues of global importance and engaging in innovative cross-disciplinary work will be the characteristics of Cardiff's research reputation. We're already ahead here, with our three flagship Research Institutes paving the way for novel solutions to sustainability, cancer, neuroscience and mental health. These are key aspects of our research repertoire and we will continue to develop them over the coming years. We must also be bold and look beyond our own campus, building our research capacity by partnering with

other like-minded universities. Not only will this help us compete for funding in an increasingly tough sector, but it will bolster our reputation and help us succeed in addressing some of society's biggest challenges.

A Cardiff education will continue to be research-led, challenging, and highly sought after. Our graduates will be equipped with skills to help them make the transition from education to employment with ease and they will be in demand from leading employers. One of my first tasks as Vice-Chancellor was to open the new Centre for Skills, Enterprise & Volunteering. It's helping our students boost their CVs and future job prospects. We must continue to respond to the needs of our students and ensure that we are providing them with an outstanding and well-rounded educational experience. Above all, a Cardiff education will not be exclusive. It will be open to the best and brightest students capable of thriving during their time with us regardless of background. At the end of 2012, we announced that Cardiff had joined UK leading universities as part of Futurelearn, a new, free, open online learning platform run by the Open University. Now we can take some of the best education in Wales to the world, and

bring the world of higher education to learners in Wales.

Internationally, I want Cardiff to establish its position as a global university, recruiting talented students from overseas to Wales and collaborating with outstanding institutions around the world. The establishment of a thriving overseas campus is an investment we must seriously consider. It will not only give Cardiff leverage in the international student market but will help foster student mobility and promote greater global partnerships, with enviable returns in terms of our reputation. Encouraging a more strategic approach to outward mobility will result in more of our students and staff experiencing the transformative effect of studying or working abroad.

In Wales, our knowledge exchange partnerships must make the most of our world-leading expertise, helping businesses grow and community projects to succeed. We want to help drive sustained growth and prosperity across the nation. Our social and environmental responsibilities need to be realised: we must build on our work to control our carbon emissions and fulfil our commitment to sustainability. Raising aspirations and engaging the local community in Cardiff's work and world will be two areas we will concentrate on in the time ahead.

Woven throughout these four key areas will be our guiding principles, amongst them dynamism, integrity, respect for people and diversity, and self determination. Cardiff is committed to providing a rich environment for our staff and students to flourish, and to contributing to the development of our communities, be they local or global.

The higher education market is moving at pace, and we must keep up. Along with the priority areas I've outlined above, we at Cardiff must invest in our staff, students,

facilities and infrastructure. Concentrating on these priority areas will not only help put us ahead of our competitors, but will create an environment that gives each individual the support and resources they need to achieve their goals.

As I mentioned at the start, 2012 was a year of two leadership halves for Cardiff. During the last months of his tenure, my predecessor Dr David Grant led a high-level delegation to China to launch a new joint institute for oncology research involving Cardiff and Peking University, one of the most highly-respected institutions in China. A new International Centre for Biomedical Research was also opened, this time involving Cardiff and China's Capital Medical University. These collaborations are delivering internationally excellent outcomes with benefits for patients around the world.

The year also saw Cardiff's staff excel on the world stage. Two of our senior academics were elected Fellows of the Royal Society: Professor Hywel Thomas for his innovative work on geo-environmental research, and Professor John Aggleton for expanding our understanding of how memory is stored in the brain. In addition we are very proud that Professor Harry Collins was made a Fellow of the British Academy for his role in establishing the sociological study of science.

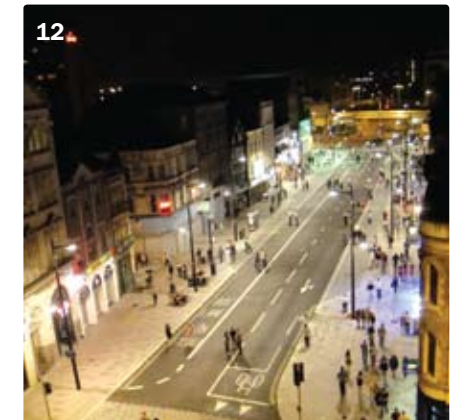
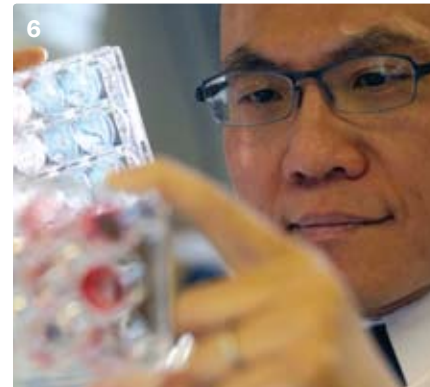

# Our year in pictures



**1** A new catalytic process discovered by the Cardiff Catalysis Institute could unleash a range of useful new by-products from diesel fuel production.

**2** An international team, including Dr Chris Berry of the School of Earth and Ocean Sciences unearthed and investigated the Gilboa fossil forest in upstate New York, an entire fossil forest dating back 385 million years.

**3** Four of the University's forward-thinking and inspiring speakers took part in TEDxCARDIFF. Supported by the University, the event gave audiences, at the event and online, a chance to learn about and share ideas on science, art, creativity and adventure.

**4** Professors Paul Furlong and Richard Wyn Jones (pictured above) of the School of European Language, Translation & Politics and Professor Philip Thomas, Cardiff Law School, received the award of Academician of the Academy of Social Sciences for their outstanding contribution to the social sciences.

**5** Cardiff University's Vertical Studio module gave students from the Welsh School of Architecture the chance to project images and animations onto iconic University buildings.

**6** The Arthritis Research UK Experimental Arthritis Treatment Centre, Wales' first research centre dedicated to developing new drugs and treatments to ease the pain and suffering of arthritis sufferers was opened at the School of Medicine.

**7** An author, broadcaster and presenter and the first Welsh women to have been appointed a High Court judge were among those honoured by the University at our annual degree ceremonies. Tony Robinson and The Hon. Mrs Justice Nicola Davies DBE joined ten other eminent individuals to receive Honorary Fellowships.

**8** Budding engineers had the chance to design and build their own wind turbine when the University took its work out to the community at the 2012 National Eisteddfod.

**9** A camera trapping programme by researchers from the School of Biosciences at the Danau Girang Field Centre in Sabah, Malaysia found that animals rely on forest corridors for moving between forest patches.

**10** More students than ever before gained a place at a higher education institution thanks to the University's successful widening access scheme, Step Up to University.

**11** Broadcaster, writer, comedian and environmental advocate Griff Rhys Jones led a celebration of the work of Cardiff's flagship Sustainable Places Research Institute during the University's 2012 Sustainability Week. Griff became Patron of the Institute in 2011.

**12** A violence prevention model established by Professor Jonathan Shepherd, School of Dentistry was adopted by the Dutch government in an effort to reduce violent behaviour.



# Research World-leading excellence

Cardiff's research has an impact far beyond our campus and is known for its hallmarks of originality, significance and rigour. In the last year, University researchers have discovered a new property of black holes and are also helping change attitudes amongst healthcare professionals to improve the care of older people. Our interdisciplinary approach to tackling critical issues is internationally respected and has delivered results in neuroscience and mental health, sustainability, cancer and catalysis, amongst others.

## Understanding Welsh rivers

A pioneering project led by researchers from the School of Biosciences and Sustainable Places Research Institute will look at the role played by biodiversity in preserving the quality and wildlife of Welsh rivers and the many livelihoods that depend upon them. The research area will range from small catchments around Llyn Brianne in central Wales to the whole Welsh uplands.

## Award-winning work

Professors Mike Owen and Mick O'Donovan from the University's MRC Centre for Neuropsychiatric Genetics and Genomics and the Neuroscience and Mental Health Research Institute collected The Lieber Prize in New York in recognition of their 'outstanding' work into the causes, prevention, and treatment of schizophrenia. Their research has helped identify the first robustly supported susceptibility genes for schizophrenia and identified likely disease mechanisms.



## Royal Society success

Professor Hywel Thomas, School of Engineering and Pro Vice-Chancellor, International & Engagement, and Professor John Aggleton, School of Psychology, were both elected Fellows of the Royal Society. Professor Aggleton is a neuroscientist who has widely expanded understanding of how memory is stored in the brain. Professor Thomas has dramatically advanced understanding of transport processes in the ground.



## Ultrasound scanning experience

Cardiff spin-out company MedaPhor successfully raised £1.06M in an equity funding round to accelerate US sales and new product development of ScanTrainer, a virtual 'real feel' ultrasound-training simulator that provides students with a 24/7, educationally driven, training programme that replicates a real ultrasound scanning experience. Trainees develop the complex mix of cognitive skills and eye-hand movement coordination, but without the need for an ultrasound machine or a patient and with considerably reduced direct supervision by an expert.

## Improved leukaemia treatment

A major Cancer Research UK-funded trial led by Professor Alan Burnett, School of Medicine and the European Cancer Stem Cell Research Institute found that Acute Myeloid Leukaemia patients given a new type of 'smart drug' in addition to chemotherapy treatment are 22 per cent less likely to relapse and around 13 per cent less likely to die from their disease.

## Protecting historic buildings

Scientists at the School of Chemistry have developed a new treatment that could help protect the UK's historic limestone buildings from erosion. Working on York Minister's iconic magnesian limestone cathedral they utilised 'hydrophobic surface coatings' which protects limestone from erosion by acid rain and atmospheric pollutants, while allowing the stone to 'breathe'.



## Exploring Ham Hill

Excavations at Ham Hill in Somerset, Britain's largest prehistoric hillfort gave Cardiff and Cambridge archaeologists a glimpse of what life was like inside the fort more than 2000 years ago. Among their findings was an Iron Age house with a stone wall built from slabs of the local Ham stone – possibly the first Ham Stone house in Britain.

## Creative Citizens

Cardiff is one of three universities awarded funding for research that will transform the way that our communities interact with the cultural and creative economies of the UK. The 'Understanding the Value of Creative Citizens' project, led by Professor Ian Hargreaves of the School of Journalism, Media and Cultural Studies and Cardiff Business School will focus on the bedrock of the creative economy – creative citizens.





# Students

## The difference is Cardiff

Cardiff students study and socialise every day with a talented peer group drawn to Cardiff from more than 100 different countries worldwide. Research-led teaching and direct access to our world-leading staff are available to all, regardless of social, spatial or financial barriers. While they're with us, our students enjoy award-winning courses, an inclusive and supportive culture, state-of-the-art sports facilities and unrivalled access to some of the UK's biggest employers.

### A top 20 University

Cardiff has gained further recognition as one of the UK's top 20 universities and comfortably retained its position as the top university in Wales in *The Sunday Times University Guide 2013*. The guide makes particular reference to the strong employability of Cardiff graduates, noting "*this powerhouse of academic and research excellence boasts one of the best graduate employment rates in Britain. Students don't just get any old job either - most secure degree-level posts with decent starting salaries.*" The University was also shortlisted for the University of the Year title in *The Sunday Times University Guide 2013*.

### Online access for all

Cardiff is one of ten leading UK universities to join Futurelearn, a platform run by the Open University that will give students in Wales, across the UK and around the world free online access to courses. The initiative enables Cardiff to extend access to its high quality education experience around the world and to help open higher education to all who can benefit.

### Best performing course

Cardiff's Newspaper Journalism postgraduate training was named as the Best Performing Higher Education Postgraduate course in 2011-2012 by the National Council for the Training of Journalists with Cardiff students achieving higher marks than their peers around the country.

### Supporting students

Cardiff is one of only seven universities to have achieved top marks in a Stonewall checklist for assessing how supportive universities are for lesbian, gay and bisexual prospective students. The Stonewall *Gay by Degree* guide helps perspective students choose a university that will welcome and support LGB students, allowing them to be themselves and contributing to their student experience.

### Inspiring a generation at London 2012

One of the University's High Performance athletes helped inspire a generation by winning a medal at the 2012 Paralympic Games in London. Jenny McLoughlin, a student in the School of English, Communication and Philosophy, raced in the 4x100m T37 relay, running the last leg for Team GB and bringing them home in third place to take a Bronze medal.

### Broadening horizons

The Centre for Skills, Enterprise & Volunteering, a new employability hub in the Students' Union, is giving Cardiff students the opportunity to bolster their CVs and future job prospects. Located in the Centre are three of the University's successful student services - The Skills Development Service, Student Volunteering Cardiff and Student Enterprise Cardiff - all of which help provide students with additional training, qualifications and experience.



### Sporting success

Cardiff students triumphed in the Welsh Varsity competition, securing the Varsity Shield and winning back the Varsity Cup for the University. In an impressive sporting display, Cardiff students beat their Swansea counterparts across more than 20 different sports including basketball, squash and football, to scoop the Varsity Shield and won 33-13 at the Millennium Stadium to take the Varsity rugby Cup.





# Engagement Enriching Wales

Cardiff drives economic development in Wales, with our partnerships and knowledge transfer activities boosting prosperity and growth. Our community engagement activities are bringing the University into the every day lives of people across the country, helping raise attainment in schoolchildren and giving adult learners the opportunity to experience research-led teaching. When people can't come to us, we take our work to them, from our exhibits at the National Eisteddfod, our hands-on guerrilla archaeology at the Green Man Festival or our dental care unit in the Cynon Valley.

## Discovering Celtic Cardiff

Schoolchildren and local residents of the Ely and Caerau community were involved in excavating and exploring an Iron Age hillfort in the area to help them connect with the past. Led by the School of History, Archaeology and Religion, the CAER Heritage Project helped create a heightened sense of place for the people of these areas, developed educational opportunities and challenged some unfounded stereotypes often ascribed to this part of Cardiff.

## Homework club praise

The Children's Commissioner for Wales has praised the work of University students in supporting a local community homework club. Established by Adamsdown Communities First and the Adamsdown African Association, the club sees University students support and encourage children with their homework, exam preparation and other learning activities. It aims to raise attainment and achievement with students



in inner city schools and colleges, in particular children from families who have little or no history of going to university. The club is now being used as an example that other higher education institutions should adopt, to relieve child poverty.

## Dental services for all

A new Primary Care Dental Unit in the Cynon Valley was officially opened to provide a wide range of free dental care from final year School of Dentistry students to residents without a dentist. An estimated 10,000 people in the Cynon Valley do not have access to a dentist. The state-of-the-art unit at Ysbyty Cwm Cynon will help patients reach a good standard of dental health and then allow them to register fully with a dentist.



## BookTalk

*BookTalk* is the University's exciting book group that brings together people who love to read and discuss books. BookTalkers, as they're known, meet every two months and read the very best classic and contemporary literature, discussing the big ideas behind great books. As part of the meetings Cardiff

## Engineering a better society

Exhibits showcasing the University's world-leading engineering research were on show at the prestigious Royal Academy of Engineering Summer Soirée. The event, hosted by Cardiff highlighted the crucial role of engineers in developing solutions to a diverse range of environmental, social, health and economic challenges.



## Pathway to learning

A unique scheme offering adult learners the chance to access higher education has helped seven local adult learners transform their lives and progress onto a degree scheme. The award-winning Exploring the Past Pathway scheme is run collaboratively by the Centre for Lifelong Learning and the School of History, Archaeology and Religion. It is designed to give adult learners the opportunity to experience research-led teaching first hand and progress towards studying a degree in archaeology, history or religion.

## Olympic torch bearers



Three of the University's most inspirational staff and students carried the Olympic Flame as it made its way through Cardiff in 2012. Ruby Miller, Guylee Simmonds and Stuart Vanstone made up part of the 8,000 Torchbearers who carried the Flame across the UK. Ruby was selected to carry the Flame for her commitment to her studies and sport, Guylee for his dedication to charity work, and Stuart for his contribution to putting Cardiff at the forefront of Olympic and Paralympic activity in Wales.



# International A global university

At Cardiff, an international focus runs throughout all of our activities. It's underpinned by our aim to create global impact through academic excellence and to share best practice with our international partners. Our research and people are at the forefront of some of the world's most pressing problems, from tackling breast cancer in China to conservation in Malaysia. We're also making sure borders aren't barriers to studying with us, developing links with other countries and making a Cardiff education accessible to all – wherever they may be in the world.

## Earth's oldest known crater impact

An international team of researchers including Dr Iain McDonald from the School of Earth and Ocean Sciences discovered the remains of a giant three billion-year-old impact near the Maniitsoq region of West Greenland. The discovery means that scientists can study the effects of cratering on the Earth nearly a billion years further back in time than was possible before.

## Advancing education in a Tuk Tuk

Cardiff is supporting a round-the world Tuk Tuk expedition to help promote and advance education. Led by Cardiff graduate Nick Gough and Rich Sears, the pair are raising awareness of the challenge of improving global access to education during their trip. They also aim to fundraise for grassroots, community-based educational projects and set the world record for the longest journey in an auto-rickshaw.



## Welcoming America's brightest minds

Eight talented US students were welcomed to Wales to study the nation's culture, politics, geography, economy and history. Hosted by Cardiff, Bangor and Aberystwyth



Universities, the American undergraduates met people the length and breadth of the country during their trip. The six-week Fulbright Summer Institute involved the internationally-recognised research and teaching specialisms of all three universities. Cardiff's links with the US were further strengthened when it hosted the first visit by the National Association of Fellowship Advisors to Wales, which aimed to encourage some of the most prestigious American students to see Cardiff and Wales as a destination of choice to boost their studies and educational experience.

## Raffles comes to Cardiff

The School of Music welcomed a group of talented Singaporean music students and their teachers from Raffles Institution and Raffles Girls School during their British tour. The group was invited by Professor Kenneth Hamilton, who has a long-standing involvement with the Raffles Academy Programme for elite students in Singapore. The students participated in a piano and strings masterclass focusing on music by Beethoven and Granados with acclaimed



performers Professor Hamilton and Professor Robin Stowell.

## Science without Borders

Cardiff is one of the approved Universities accepted for the Science without Borders scholarship programme funded by the Brazilian Government. The programme will allow Cardiff to forge closer links with leading Brazilian universities and welcome more talented students to the University – seven undergraduates have been welcomed to the University under the scheme to date.



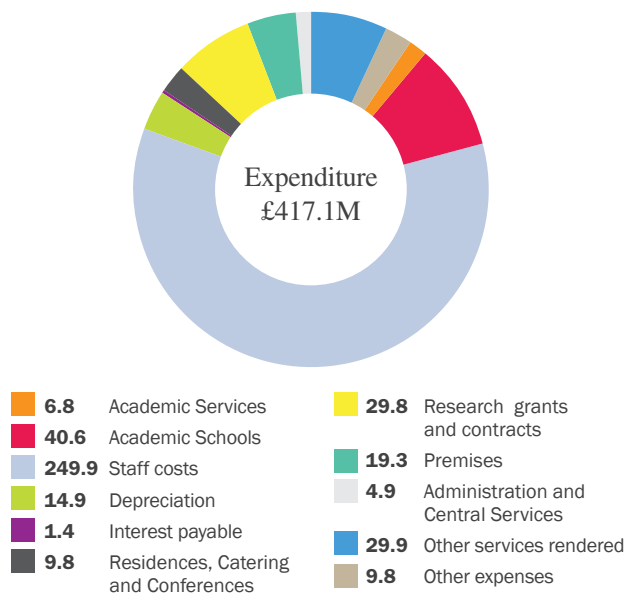
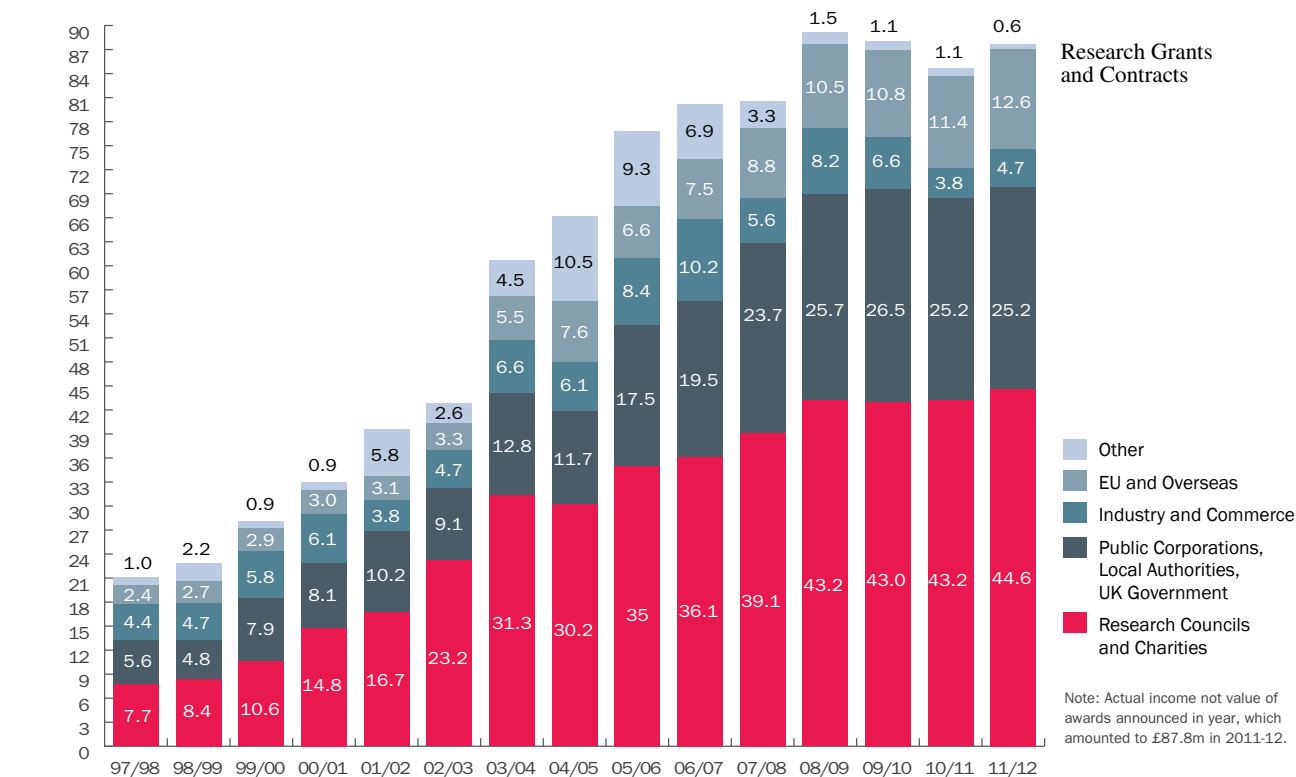
## Sharing knowledge with China

Organised by the National Academy of Educational Administration, in association with the British Council Beijing, the UK-China Forum consisted of a 28 strong delegation of Chinese University Presidents, Vice-Presidents and Party Secretaries - alongside speakers from across the UK - to share management knowledge.
